Dear Parents,

As you probably know by now, Governor DeWine has ordered schools to be closed for 3 weeks beginning Monday, March 16, 2020. Friday, March 13th, will be our last student day for 3 weeks. Starting Monday, March 16th, we will initiate the following plan to educate students at home. Elementary students will be provided paper packets of instructional materials Friday, March 13th at school. Junior high and high school students will be provided online assignments. Any junior high or high school student in need of an internet hotspot may sign one out from their school.

Students are to complete home based assignments for 2 weeks, from Monday, March 16th through Friday, March 27th. Teachers may be emailed through their school email account during normal school hours for support. On Monday, March 16th, the buildings will be open and staff available for any students who need to pick up assignments and/or materials.

Spring break will be changed to March 30th through April 3rd. Students are to report to school on the originally scheduled spring break days of April 6th through April 13th, with the exception of April 10th (Good Friday).

The revised district calendar is attached for your information. A summary of the revised school calendar is as follows:

- Monday, March 16 - Friday, March 27 - Student Home-Based Assignments Days
- Monday, March 30 - Friday, April 3 - Spring Break
- Monday April 6 - School Resumes
- Friday, April 10 - No School – Good Friday
- Monday, April 13 - School Resumes

All athletic, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities are canceled after Friday, March 13th until school resumes April 6th. All student trips are canceled after Friday, March 13th until school resumes April 6th. This means that beginning Saturday, all activities are canceled. Keep in mind that while we are using the 3rd week of the shut-down ordered by Governor DeWine as our spring break, we are still under the Governor's order to shut down.
