Paul R. Callahan – Class of 1966

Participated in Baseball, Basketball and Cross Country at LHS. Basketball-Team captain, Most Valuable Senior and Leading Rebounder on the first Final Four Team for LHS. Set a school record of 13.4 rebounds per game in 1965-66 while averaging double figures in scoring. High School All American in 1966. Attended the University of Louisville on a Basketball Scholarship. UofL was ranked in the top 20 all four years including a preseason #2 ranking in 1967-68. MVC champions two times – Participated in two NCAA and two NIT Tournaments. Baseball – Record of 31-4 as a pitcher for LHS and Post 11 American Legion Baseball. Pitched no-hitter and had an ERA of .69 at LHS in 1966. All State American Legion Team in 1966. Turned down offers from Detroit Tigers and Pittsburgh Pirates to attend college. Played baseball at UofL for two years as a walk-on. Led the team with a 1.21 ERA in 1969. Teacher, coach and AD in the JCPS system for 30 years. Named Athletic Director of the Year for the State of Kentucky in 1999. Metro Area Athletic Director's Hall of Fame Inductee in 2002.

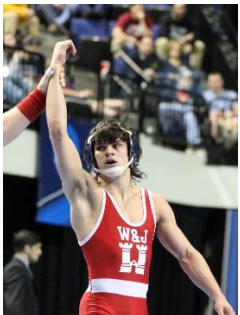
George Carpenter - Class of 2007

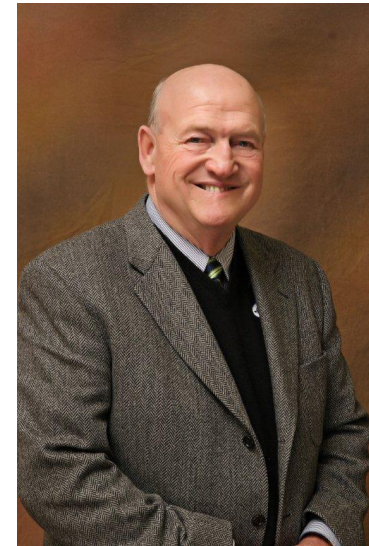
